

WPTC Q & A

- Q1. I'm new to the club. How can I meet people and find hitting partners?
A1. Sign up for our Round Robins: Tuesdays a.m. and p.m. (for ladies), Thursdays p.m. (for men), once monthly on a Sunday (mixed).
Sign up for the Tennis Ladder (see below).
Sign up on the Hitting Partners list in the clubhouse.
- Q2. How do I sign up for a Round Robin?
A2. Phone the club (845 7649) starting the Saturday prior, leaving your name, phone number and desired event.
- Q3. I need lessons. Whom do I contact?
A3. Contact our pro, Bobby Armitage, at 845 7649 or go online at www.oakvilleacademyoftennis.com
- Q4. I'm a good player and would like to play competitive tennis on a WPTC team. What should I do?
A4. Come out for our tryouts (dates listed in Newsletter). If you miss the scheduled date, contact the team convenor or team captain .
- Q5. How do I sign up for the Tennis Ladder?
Q5. Phone the club; leave your name and phone # for the manager. You will be contacted when you have been added to the Ladder. Check the rules inside the clubhouse. For this program to be successful, you should make an effort to make contacts; don't sit back and wait for others to phone you for a match.
- Q6. How do I know what's going on at the club during any particular week?
A6. See the Newsletter.
Check the outside Bulletin Board.
Ask a court attendant.
Check the Blackboard on the Sign-up Board outside.
- Q7. Where do I find the club rules and membership list?
A7. In the club Phone Book, published in June.
Ask a court attendant.
- Q8. I really want to be the WPTC Team Convenor. Whom do I contact?
A8. We urgently need a volunteer for this position! Please contact our president, Jan Tingle.
- Q9. How do I sign up for a court?
A9. Give your last name, and your partner's, to a court attendant, who will put them on the Board outside. (If the attendant is not present, you put the (last) names on the Board yourself. You cannot sign up, leave, then return for your timed game; you must stay until your game time arrives.

Q10. Can I bring a guest?

A10. Yes, you may bring guests up to 4 times per year. If you play on court 4, there is no fee to pay. If you play on any other court, each guest must pay \$5 (given to a court attendant or put in an envelope from the wall near the office door and slipped under the door).

Q11. If a non-member is playing, does s/he have to pay a fee?

A11. Not if s/he plays on court 4. Non-members may not play on any other court, unless they pay the \$5 fee.
